This year we've got some new security features throughout the school building, some pretty advanced. There is now a keypad on the Rm. 2 door, new window covering, new cameras, and even new door handles on all of the classroom doors that work in an interesting way. But the most interesting of them all to me is the new key pad placed on the outside die door. Most of the teachers think that it's a great addition to the school, and they know it's for their safety and the safety of the students. Even some of the students think that it's a great added security to the school.



The new keypad was added by the school to add to the existing security features and to meet or exceed some new recommended additional safety features. The Broward County Sheriff's Office did their once a year walk through before school began and while they liked what they saw, they also had a few new recommendations, all of which the school put into place. From my interview with Mr. L and Mrs. Kelly they both were saying the same things about the importance of safety and security in schools. Ms. Dykens, the Science Teacher also made a good point when it they came to the door. She stated that "the keypad on the door is good for security but it also helps with the traffic coming in and out of the building by students. She said that it would help to reduce the number of students in that hallway at the same time".



I also did some research on the most recent school shooting that happened here in Florida. On February 14, 2018 an expelled student entered Parkland, Florida's Marjory Stillman Douglas High School and opened fire, killing 17 people and wounding 17 others, in what became at the time was the deadliest shooting at a high school in United States history but after that, sadly there have been an increase of shootings in a few different states. The most recent shooting happened at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas. This shooting was so deadly that it was on par with the shooting that happened in 2012, when a gunman shot and killed 26 people as young as 6 years old at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut. Knowing these things many county offices and police organizations have taken a bigger lead in inspecting schools. With the increase in the school shooting around the country the preventative methods is need in all school, including FLPS.

The keypad is something we need for our safety even though some students think otherwise. School shootings are not a joke, they can happen anywhere and anytime. It can be totally unexpected. So it's good when schools make changes to increase student safety and security.

Since the schools beginning in 1986 this has been a yearly tradition and the school plans on continuing with the event and hopes that every year it gets better and better. 
In this ever growing world, there has been a vast need for technology. From cell phones to computers, everyone uses technology on a regular basis. Schools have moved from regular chalk board smart boards and flat screens and from typewriters to computers. Here at FLPS we integrate technology in the curriculum. Students must have some sort of knowledge of computers and their uses. Students need a computer to access the school's homework website and to access their email for information from their teachers.

Teachers, staff and administrators all use technology on a regular basis. They utilized technology to communicate with our parents; they also rely on the technology to input grades, provide attendance, and daily (behavior) and progress reports. Teachers find that the technology makes teaching less stressful. Teachers reported that despite the students writing in their planner, the use of the technology for homework posting is a great idea. It is an added resource for students as well as parents to know what is required for the students while they are at home. Technology can also be used by staff at teachers to show content on the large flat screen TVs in all classrooms and to present lessons to the class.



It is beneficial for students to have access to technology. The school provides each classroom with as many laptops as they need. Some of the students have Florida Virtual School as a course and the students are able to work on them during the period that is assigned. This allows the students who do not have access to computer at home to complete the needed assignments. There are also students who stay after for homework help and they are also able to use the computers during the time. The students at the school find that technology in school and having access to it benefits them tremendously.

The school also offers a course in Computer Science taught by the technology teacher Mr. Almanzar. His curriculum consists of teaching the students how to type for speed and accuracy, how to create documents using Microsoft Office, as well as to introducing the students to virtual reality assimilation where students are able to experience the world without leaving the classroom. Once those basic skill are in place, students next learn PowerPoint so they can create presentations. Mr. Almanzar expresses that "technology is used to enhance the learning by adding other elements that can make it more interesting and fun".

"We do not participate in any federal food programs so we don't provide free lunch" said Ms. Dykens. In the past the food was provided by a catering company and a list was sent out to the parents. The parents would select the food for the child and would pay in advance. However, this way of providing lunch faded away due the child not eating the food that was being provided.
